



PATH GEOGRAPHY

When you are hiking or working on the PATH section, do you know what county you are in?

The southern end of our section begins at VA 670 on the South Fork of the Holston River in $\underline{\text{SMYTH}}$ $\underline{\text{COUNTY}}$.

We continue for about 25 miles then cross into $\underline{\text{WYTHE}}$ $\underline{\text{COUNTY}}$ about a mile short of Crawfish Valley.

After passing Crawfish Valley, we climb Walker Mountain to Tilson Gap where we cross into \underline{BLAND} COUNTY. (At Tilson Gap three countles come together: Smyth, Wythe, and Bland. Take along a topo map sometime and try to find the spot.)


Leaving Tilson Gap we drop down off Walker and, as we cross VA 610, we also cross back into <u>SMYTH</u> <u>COUNTY</u> for a short

At the top of the high meadow we enter the woods and cross back into $\underline{\text{BLAND}}$ $\underline{\text{COUNTY}}.$

We continue in Bland to Chestnut Ridge where we meet, but do not cross, the ${\tt TAZEWBLL}$ COUNTY line.

The BLAND-TAZEWELL County Line follows Chestnut Ridge past the Chestnut Knob Shelter, down the ridge to Walker Gap, and along the ridge of Garden Mountain to VA 623.

As you hike the 8 miles from Chestnut Ridge to VA 623, your left food will be in ${\tt TAZEWELL}$ COUNTY and your right in ${\tt BLAND}$
