The Appalachian Trail Conference in the early '60s, after its members had been assisting with the maintenance of the area for many years, assigned the PIEDMONT APPALACHIAN TRAIL HIKERS (PATH) maintenance responsibilities on 42 miles of TRAIL from the Mt. Rogers National Recreation Area Headquarters on Va. Hwy. 16 near Marion, Va., north to Va. St. Rt. 623 atop the picturesque Garden Mountain which encircles the entire Burkes Garden area like the rim of a punch bowl.
