
LINDAMOOD SCHOOL is a one room school located on the grounds of The Settlers Museum of Southwest Virginia at Groseclose, Virginia. The restored school is representative of an era when such schools were prevalent. Smyth County had 62 such schools in 1894.

The school has been equipped with homemade wooden desks, books of the time like McGuffey's Readers and Spellers, wood burning stove, dinner pails, water bucket and dipper, homemade lye soap and a hickory switch for discipline. The outhouses have been reconstructed and are functional.
